




To empower persons with spinal cord injuries & other physical disabilities to achieve independence & full community participation

MORE THAN 5,000 ALBERTANS LIVE WITH A TRAUMATIC SPINAL CORD INJURY

SCI Alberta is a charitable organization that helps individuals and their families rebuild & redefine their lives after a spinal cord injury.

We provide information, help the injured & their family adjust to their new reality, link them to peers & we collaborate with other organizations to build accessible communities.



HOW DID WE HELP?



- We worked with our clients to achieve over 2,000 goals related to health, housing, financials support, equipment supports and accessibility changes in their homes & communities
- Over 40% of our clients goals are related to health and home care
- Our client service coordinators responded to over 1,500 requests for information

INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

- Respect for Indigenous culture and tradition a is a core value. We provide services to Indigenous clients in urban, rural and on reserve. Last year our client service coordinators met with over 75 Indigenous clients
- Over 65% of them had a spinal cord injury
- The most remote location we visit is High Level, Alberta

The Provincial SCI Strategy Committee

SCI Alberta is represented on this committee made

up of representatives from the fields of basic science, clinical science, community services, Alberta Health Services (AHS) and the Rick Hansen Institute. This group is supported by The Alberta Paraplegic Foundation and Campus Alberta Neuroscience and is chaired by Dr. Ian Rigby MD who himself is a person with a spinal cord injury. The proposed initiatives as approved by persons with lived experience will focus on evidenced based research, clinical care and community service that enhances quality of life.



COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Rick Hansen Spinal Cord Injury Registry Community Follow-up Pilot

The community follow up project is led by Dr. Chester Ho and funded by Brain Canada and The Alberta Paraplegic Foundation. The project involves the transition of data gathering by research coordinators to SCI Alberta staff members who enter the anonymized data in a global research platform but also provide follow up services or referrals to specialized clinical services for physical and metal health issues that are identified through the use of evidence based tools.



PEER PROGRAM

Adjusting to life after a spinal cord injury is a difficult journey, This journey can be supported by SCI Alberta's network of peer mentors who can share their successful lived experience. They can inform and inspire others to adjust, adapt and thrive.









SCI ALBERTA FITNESS CENTER
